

Lenten Observances 2014

Fasting in the Maronite Tradition

Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking **nothing at all** (*except water and medicine*) **from midnight until noon**. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat.

PS: Pregnant women and persons who are sick are not required to fast.

Weekdays of Lent

There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self denial are recommended.

Ash Monday & Great Friday

These are days of **Fast and Abstinence from meat**, for every person who is physically capable (18-60 yrs old). All who are physically capable are to fast on these 2 days.

Fridays of Lent

All who have reached their 14th birthday, and they are physically capable, are to abstain from meat on Ash Monday and all Fridays of Lent.

Easter Duty Obligation

After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by obligation to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess their sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten and Easter Season.

The Season of Great Lent

On Ash Monday, March 03, we begin the 40 day journey of Lent when Christians, through the disciplines of prayer, fasting and self-denial, strengthen our relationship with God.

We will seek to identify and repent of those obstacles in our life that mar God's image and prevent us from recognizing His plan for our well being. Ash Monday always falls 48 days before Easter.

For Western Christians, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. For Eastern Rite Catholics, however, Great Lent begins two days before the Western date of Ash Wednesday.

Ash Monday is a reminder that we should begin Lent with good intentions and a desire to clean our spiritual house. It is a day of strict fasting for Eastern Catholics, including abstinence from meat.

A Day of Repentance

The distribution of ashes reminds us of our own mortality and calls us to repentance. In the early Church, Ash Monday was the day on which those who had sinned, and who wished to be readmitted to the Church, would begin their public penance. The ashes that we receive are a reminder of our own sinfulness, and many Catholics leave them on their foreheads all day as a sign of humility.

Fasting and Abstinence Are Required

The Church emphasizes the penitential nature of Ash Monday by calling us to fast and abstain from meat. Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat, or any food made with meat, on Ash Monday and Great Friday.

Taking Stock of Our Spiritual Life

This fasting and abstinence is not simply a form of penance, however; it is also a call for us to take stock of our spiritual lives. As Lent begins, we should set out specific spiritual goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them—for instance, by going to daily Mass when we can and receiving the Sacrament of Confession more often.

Lenten Challenge

The Next 40 Days Can Revolutionize Your Walk with God A New Testament Reading Guide for Lent 2014

What if you spent the next 40 days walking alongside Jesus, listening to His life-changing teachings, visiting churches with Paul, and falling more in love with God with each turning page?

Now reading the entire New Testament in 40 days isn't easy. It demands intentionality. It requires us to reach for the Bible instead of Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest, or any other Mass Media Interest. Commit each day to reading for approximately a half hour or so.

- * Ask God to open your eyes, ears, and heart to what He has prepared for you as you read each day.
- Write a checkmark or X in the box when you finish that day's reading.
- Celebrate the wonder of God's Word each Sunday. There are no assigned readings on Sundays; feel free to rest or catch-up on missed readings.
- * Share what God is revealing to you during Lent.
 Our prayer is that at the end of 40 days, you'll feel so spiritually full you'll never want to live on empty again.
