MARY, OUR LINK TO REDEMPTION

Saint Paul says: "There is one Mediator, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (1 Tim 2:5). What then is the place of Mary in the Universal Church, in the Maronite Church and in our lives? The Maronite Church has always had a great devotion to Mary the Mother of God. In the small villages, homes, mountains, hills and streets of Lebanon we find shrines of all types to Our Lady. Hymns, feast days and the liturgical life of the Maronite Church clearly express this great devotion to the Blessed Mother. Why?

It is because God has linked Mary to all of the Mysteries of the Incarnation: the Redemption, the Eucharist, the distribution of graces, intercession and mediation. The Church of Christ is also linked to all of these mysteries. To remove her from the picture would be also to erase the very Mystery of the Incarnation itself and defy the will of God and Christ Himself.

We cannot ignore the place of Mary in the Redemption. Truths about Mary cannot be pushed to one side; they are not isolated Christian truths which concern just Mary alone. She never stands alone, separated from Christ, but is always linked to Him! Mary gave birth to the Son of God and lived intimately, like any loving mother, with Him for thirty years, doing everything for His service. In the evenings what did they talk about? Carpentry? Was his laundry done? What did He want her to cook for dinner? Did she not know her Son, Jesus, on a most intimate level? We have been exhorted by the Fathers of the Church to imitate her.

The more we respect the Mystery of the Incarnation, the Redemption, and the Church, the more we will honor the role that Mary plays in each of them, and in our lives as her faithful, yet sinful, servants.

May: the Month of Mary

Our lady of Beshwat (Bechouat)

Over a hundred years ago in the little town of Bechwat, Bekaa, Lebanon a statue of the Virgin Mary of Hope became famous for many miracle cures by Her intersession. The statue shows Mary wearing a blue dress with stars all over, an expression of Queen of Heaven. She is holding a cross in Her hands and has a crown of gold on Her head. The small Church sets on the side of a mountain in a remote area above



the fertile valley. On the side of this mountain grows fruit trees of every kind. The Church (now a shrine) is only 20 feet long and 20 feet wide and the statue sets on the left side of the altar. A few years back the pastor built a new much larger church just above the old one, but left the famous statue in the old church. Masses (Maronite Catholic) are held in the new church and special honor to Our Lady is in the old Church, now the Shrine of Notre Dame de Bechwat.

One of the miracles attributed to Our Lady of Bechouat happened to a Lebanese man, Tony Sukkar, 37, who resided in New York. Sukkar suffered from a chronic disease, which paralyzed his upper body completely. Upon a visit to his native Lebanon, Mr. Sukkar visited the old church where he prayed to be healed. Soon after, he was healed and able to move his upper body. Sukkar constructed a statue of the Virgin Mary in his home town of Deir el Ahmar in honor of Our Lady of Bechouat..

Apparition of Our Lady at Pontmain France 1871

At the small town of Pontmain, France on a cold winter evening, January 17, 1871, the Virgin Mary appeared to four children. Eugene, age 12, and his brother Joseph, age 10, were the first to see her in the sky. They described a beautiful lady in a dark blue dress covered with stars. She wore a black veil with a golden crown on her head. Two little girls, Francoise Richer, age 11, and Jeanne Marie LeBosse, age 9, also saw her in the sky but the adults could not.

It was war time and the invading Prussians were near. The village people, strong in their faith, had been praying for a miracle to save them from the enemy. Our Lady appeared above a barn on the farm of the Barbadette family. A written message appeared on a large white banner which unrolled beneath the feet of Our Lady. A message was given to the people that God had heard their prayers and that He would answer their needs shortly. The single apparition lasted three hours. Within eleven days, Prussia had mysteriously withdrawn its troops. An Armistice was signed and the war was over - Pontmain and France had been spared.

Arabic iBreviary a 'gateway' to religious freedom, creator says

Rome, Italy, Apr 23, 2014 / 04:34 am (CNA/EWTN News).- Fr. Paolo Padrini, creator of the iBreviary application, said that part of his goal for the recent release of the program in Arabic is fostering religious freedom in countries persecuted for their faith.

"This, I feel, is a very useful service. It's a gateway to religious freedom. An instrument of religious freedom, or an instrument of prayer and also an instrument of peace," Fr. Padrini told CNA on April 15.

Fr. Padrini is a parish priest in Tortona, northern Italy, and is a consultant with the Pontifical Council for Social Communications. He created the iBreviary application in 2008, which allows the faithful to pray the Liturgy of the Hours from wherever they are with just the touch of a button.

The breviary is a liturgical book used for public prayer, which is centered on the psalms. Clergy and religious promise to pray it daily, and many lay faithful choose to do so as well.

Emphasizing how Christians in Arab-speaking countries struggle to find books because they "are often censored," the priest noted that smartphones "are very widespread in the nations of the Middle East, of Asia, and of Africa."

"Often, they are more widespread than computers" he stated, "so through Arabic I wanted to offer a service, and then I also wanted to open a door to religious freedom."

"This is very important," he went on to say, "because when I pray, I pray as an Arabic person, as an Arab, not like the English. Or it could be French or it could be Italian."

Drawing attention to the fact that Christians in many parts of the world today are suffering persecution, the priest emphasized that "the worst persecution of Christians, persecution of Catholics, is not being able to pray."

"They cannot pray freely. So because of this motive I think that the application helps there a lot, in the Middle Eastern countries, and in the Arabic countries. Because it will give them a voice, it will give them a language to be able to pray."

The Arabic version of iBreviary was made available for the iPhone on April 15, and will be accessible for the iPad sometime this week. Fr. Padrini revealed that it will also be available for Google Play, Android devices, Kindle, BlackBerry and Windows Phone 7 in the coming weeks.

With all that a smartphone can do, it "must be also be an instrument of prayer," he stressed, adding that in creating it, "I didn't do anything but bring the prayers into the hands of the faithful through most simple and portable instrument possible."

A Maronite Marian prayer adapted from a hymn to Mary

"O Mary, Queen of the Mountains and Seas, Queen of our beloved Lebanon, whose glory is given to you, and whom you wished to be your emblem. O Virgin, whose purity rivals the snow of Lebanon, ... rise in glory like the cedars of Lebanon. We beg you to lay your motherly eyes on all your children and extend your pure arms to bless us. Amen."
