CAST YOUR NET ON THE RIGHT SIDE

He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat and you will find some". When they did, they were unable to haul in their catch because of the large number of fish (John 21-6).

John considers this event and message to be so important that he tacks it onto the end of his gospel. The fishing method that the apostles had always used seemed adequate but was now coming up empty. Jesus searched them out and asked the question that really irritated them: Are you catching anything? Is it working? Reluctantly, they admitted failure...no it's not working. Then came the even more irritating command...Change your method, cast your nets on the other side. Jesus told them to try something different; they didn't have to keep doing things their same old way. They would get better results by following His directions. They put their trust in Him, followed His instructions and the results were awesome!

Have you been doing the same thing over and over again without success? Are you struggling with that nagging feeling that something needs to change? Perhaps God is trying to get your attention. Maybe it's time for you to try something different, try the "other side" and do things His way.

God wants to fill your net abundantly. He is looking for you to take a bigger risk by reaching outside of your comfort zone and trusting in His ability instead of just your own. He wants you to seek His voice, and trust in Him rather than remaining on your path of old habits. Don't just remain comfortable. If it isn't working, try doing it His way, for His direction is perfect.

May is Mary's Month

Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal

Apparitions at Rue du Bac (France)



Catherine Laboure, a novitiate in the order of the Sisters of Charity, received various visions of St. Vincent and of Jesus present in the Eucharist before experiencing two apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the first vision, July 18th, 1830, Catherine is told of the impending travails of France and of an unspecified future mission. Several months later she received a message detailing the designs for a medal, later known as the Miraculous

Medal, now reproduced over a billion times and distributed around the world. The apparition was investigated in 1836 and later approved. Catherine worked for 46 more years in hospices of her Order until her death in 1876. Her body lies incorrupt at the site of the apparition to this day. She was canonized by the Church in 1947.

The Miraculous Medal

The medal is striking because Our Lady herself presented the familiar design. Mary speaks to Catherine, saying, "Have a medal struck upon this model. Those who wear it will receive great graces, especially if they wear it around their neck."

The front of the medal depicts Mary standing on a globe, with the head of a serpent beneath her feet. Circling the oval-shaped medal is the signature, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." On the reverse, twelve stars surround a large "M," from which a cross arises. Below the "M," the medal depicts two flaming hearts. The left heart, circled with thorns, represents Jesus. The right heart, pierced by a sword, symbolizes Mary.

The Front Side

- Mary stands on a globe, crushing a serpent beneath her feet. Describing the original vision, Catherine said the Blessed Mother appeared radiant as a sunrise, "in all her perfect beauty."

- Rays shoot out from Mary's hands, which she told Catherine, "... symbolize the graces I shed upon those who ask for them."

- Words from the vision form an oval frame around Mary: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."



The Reverse Side

- A cross-and-bar surmounts a large, bold "M"

- 12 stars disperse around the perimeter

- Two hearts are depicted underneath the "M," the left lapped with a crown of thorns, the right skewed by a sword. From each, a flame emanates from the top. Again, employing a grid analysis, we can see how the reverse-side design contains great symbolism reflecting major tenets of the Catholic faith.

Design Element and its Catholic Meaning

- The large letter "M" — Mary as Mother, Mediatrix.

- Cross and bar — Jesus' cross of Redemption.

- 12 stars — 12 Apostles, who formed the first Church.

- Left Heart — The Sacred Heart, who died for our sins.

- Right Heart — The Immaculate Heart, who intercedes for us.

- Flames — The burning love Jesus and Mary have for us.

10 Facts You Never Knew about

St John Paul II

- Saint John Paul II could speak Latin fluently. A rare art these days. Oh and besides his native Polish, he could also converse in: Slovak, Russian, Italian, French, Spanish, Portuguese, German, Ukrainian, and English.

- Saint John Paul II received his call to the priesthood when he once accidentally "caught" his father praying alone during the night on his knees.

- Saint John Paul II was an expert on Saint John of the Cross and the Carmelite mystical tradition. The title of one of his doctoral dissertations (yes, the man had not one, but two



doctorates) was "The Doctrine of Faith in Saint John of the Cross."

- Saint John Paul II was the first Pope to visit the White House in the United States.

- Saint John Paul II visited 129 nations during his pontificate – the most of any Pope ever (including Saint Peter)!

- Saint John Paul II holds the honor as the one human who has gathered the most humans together in one spot! At the 1995 World Youth Day in the Philippines, an estimated 5 million people attended a Mass that His Holiness celebrated. This was the largest human gathering from the creation of mankind.

- Saint John Paul II was shot on May 13, 1981 – May 13 is the anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima's first apparition!

- Saint John Paul II was elected Pope on October 16 – the feast of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque – the famous saint who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Jesus Christ. This is appropriate since the Divine Mercy devotion is a further flowering of devotion to the Sacred Heart!

- Saint John Paul II received pre-processed food through a nasal tube during the last week of his life.

- How did he die? The Vatican stated that had died from "cardiocirculatory collapse and septic shock"

Maronite Patriarch to join Pope Francis for Jerusalem visit

BEIRUT - The patriarch of the Maronite church will travel to Jerusalem next month to greet Pope Francis, the first head of his Lebanon-based denomination to visit since Israel's creation in 1948, he said Friday. Rai's visit is diplomatically noteworthy because Lebanon remains technically at war with Israel and bans its citizens from entering the Jewish state. Rai insisted that the trip will be strictly religious and has no political significance.

"It is a religious visit and in no way a political one." Rai's deputy Boulos Sayyah, who will accompany him, said the patriarch would not participate in any political meetings in Israel but will meet with Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas. Pope Francis is scheduled to make his first trip to the Holy Land from May 24-26.
