Saint of the Week: St. Jean de Brebeuf

Birth: 1593 Death: 1649

St. Jean de Brebeuf, 1593 - 1649, was a french born Jesuit missionary and martyr of New France who arrived in America in 1625 to evangelise Native Americans. He lived among the Huron for over 15 years under difficult and challenging circumstances. In 1648 the Iroquois launched a



war of extermination against the Huron, their traditional enemies. Refusing to flee when their Huron villlage was attacked, Brebeuf and his assistant, Gabriel Lalemant, were captured the following year and tortured to death by the Iroquois. Brebeuf was canonised in 1930 with seven other missionaries who are collectively called the North American martyrs. He is the patron saint of Canada. His feast day is October 19th.

10 Greek Words Every Catholic Should Know

It's hard to imagine Christianity without Greek. It's the language of the New Testament and our earliest creeds and doctrines. The very terms we use to describe God-three persons, one in being-have their roots in ancient Greek words and concepts. Needless to say, the language of Homer and Plato has profoundly shaped our faith.

Not all of us have the time to learn ancient Greek. But there are at least ten Greek words every Christian should know:

Week 4: Martyria

This is a word that should sound familiar. In Christianity, martyrs are those who were killed for their faith. But, in ancient Greek, martyria had a broader meaning, referring simply to testimony. Over time, the Church came to call those who died for their faith martyrs because they were such extraordinary witnesses to Christ. This is consistent with how the word is used in Scripture. For example, in Revelation 6:9, John has the following vision: "I saw under the altar the souls of them that were slain for the word of God and for the testimony which they held." Knowing the original meaning of this word helps us to see that we all are called to give testimony to those around us. And, even though it may not entail a physical death, it often does mean that we have to die to ourselves in some way-whether that means cutting ourselves off from the sins of the flesh, or radically serving others. In this way, martyria complements the word addressed above, evangelion. As evangelists, we witness with our words. As martyrs, we witness with our actions. We are, of course, called to be both.

The Maronite Liturgy:

Institution Narrative

The service of the Eucharist is a re-enactment of the Last Supper. It was Christ himself who called upon His disciples to "Do this in My memory until I return". At the Last Supper Christ had shown His total self-giving to the will of the Father by declaring that the bread and wine were indeed His Body being broken and His Blood shed for our redemption.

Fulfilling the divine mandate to remember and to witness, we gather about the altar as the celebrant repeats the Last Supper narrative. Just as Christ was willing to lay down His life for others, we are called to dedicate ourselves to that same ideal. In imitation of the Sacrifice of Christ, we commit ourselves to unconditional discipleship, and the willingness to pay its price, even to the point of suffering and death.

Synod sends special message to families suffering because of war

(Vatican Radio) The Synod of Bishops paused in its discussions on October 10 to send a message of support to families suffering because of warfare.

"In particular, we raise to the Lord our prayers for Iraqi and Syrian families, forced on account of their



profession of the Christian faith or their belonging to other ethnic or religious communities, to abandon everything and flee towards a future without any form of certainty," the Synod statement read." We join with the Holy Father Francis in emphasizing that no one may use the name of God to commit violence, and that to kill in the name of God is a grave sacrilege."

The Synod fathers thanked the aid organizations that are working to provide relief to refugees in the Middle East. It called on international leaders to work for the restoration of peace in the region.

The bishops promised their prayers for other families suffering because of armed conflicts elsewhere in the world. The message commended these families to the care of the Holy Family of Nazareth, "which suffered on the painful road of exile make every family a community of love and reconciliation a source of hope for the whole world."
