Year of Faith

Preparing for Lent - Part 1 - Daily Prayer



We live in world filled with electronic devices, all vying for our attention: appliances, televisions, radios, computers and cellphones - to cite just a few. Lent offers us an opportunity to slow down and open our hearts to a deeper relationship with God.

With all of this noise, how can we hear Him. Our Lord provides the answer. In the 6th Chapter of the Book of Matthew, Jesus says:

"But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." Mat 6:6

Prayer is conversation. How better to understand if we are on the proper course than to have a conversation with God. To do so, we need to start a new habit of daily prayer. Habits begin with small actions. Begin by selecting a time for your daily prayer: if you're an early riser, set aside a few minutes each morning for your time with God. Before you begin, turn off the distractions ... yes, go ahead ... turn off the tv and cell phone. Spend those quiet moments in conversation with Him; pour out your heart for Christ hears all prayers.

Jesus encourages us to pray when he says, "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Lk 11:9) He goes on to show that this is true by performing various miracles for people who ask him to do so, curing a leper and a blind beggar who come before Him in good faith, and promising the Kingdom of Heaven to the good thief who repents at Calvary.

In addition to hearing the prayers of the people, Jesus Himself is found praying numerous times throughout the Gospels, both alone and in the company of his disciples and crowds of followers. He prays before the most important times in His life, including His Baptism, Transfiguration, and many of the miracles He performs. During His Passion, the most trying and difficult hours of His life, prayer flows once again from Jesus' mouth. He prays for strength in the Garden of Gethsemane and continues praying up until His very last words on the cross: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." (Lk 23:46)

If Jesus, the perfect, divine God-Man prayed so frequently and fervently during His life on earth, how much more do we, as sinners, have a need for prayer as a part of our daily lives? Communication is an important part of any relationship, and our relationship with God is

no exception. Through communication, both parties in a relationship come to know each other better.

Next week we will explore different forms of prayer.

Requesting a Divine Liturgy (Mass for the living and the deceased)

People usually offer a free-will "stipend" that goes to the priest's charity.

Season of Epiphany – Sunday of the Priests

Today the Maronite Church begins a series of 3 Sundays dedicated to prayer for the dead. This first Sunday is set aside as a commemoration of all the deceased priests of the Church.

Christ has established the priesthood for his Church and entrusted it with great responsibilities. The priest is given the task of caring for the spiritual needs of the people of his parish. The bishop, however, is responsible for not only all the people of the diocese but also for the priests and other ministers.

The more the Lord gives to the Church, the more he asks from it. The gift of the priesthood calls the people of God, the Church, to pray for those who were entrusted with the divine mysteries and carried on the salvific work of Christ. The bishop and priest are called to be the salt of the earth and the light and presence of Christ among us. All these responsibilities have been given to men who possess human weakness and frailty.

The gospel for the Eucharist today speaks of the "faithful servant" which is, of course, the role of the priest and bishop. They are to be like the wise virgins always ready to serve the Lord, and like the faithful servant, eager to multiply the talents God has given them.

Because the priest and bishop have been given so much responsibility over the Church of God, they must know not only God's will, but must also constantly strive to be examples of fidelity and prudent action. The Church's ministers always must seek to be strong in virtue, persevering in willingness and humble and constant in action. If not, they may delay the Master's the bishop and priest, we must pray for them! This is our christian duty and it arises out of our gratitude for the service they have rendered God in his Church. We pray that all God's priests and bishops may enter into the house of the Lord and reap the rewards of the faithful servant. May the Lord entrust them with even greater things!

Sunday of the Priests Icon



"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord" (Rv 14:13)

This icon celebrates, memorials to the Three Sundays of the Deceased Priests, the Righteous and Just and the Faithful Departed. At the top left of the icon is depicted the giving of the Law to Moses on Mount Sinai, beside the burning bush, typifying the Virgin Mary and symbolizing the holiness and call of God (Ex 3:19; 32:18). On the top right is the vision of the prophet Isaiah in the Temple.

Within the apse is depicted Christ, the Pantocrator, sitting in glory and judging upon the sons of men, and surrounded by the church in heaven. His throne is carried by the four non-bodied cherubim of the Apocalypse, symbolizing the four Evangelists. In the deistic position of intercession, to the right of Christ, are His Mother and John the Baptist. Beneath them are the Archangels Michael and Gabriel, kneeling before Him in adoration. Completing the circle are the figures of St. Peter and St. Maron. Around the apse is written in Syriac, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord..." (Rv 14:13).

On the lower levels of the icon are represented those from the Church on earth, who rest in death. In the center of the upper panel is a circle representing Our Lady flanked by two angels. On the right is a panel depicting the Priests of the church; on the left are shown

the ranks of the Righteous and Just. On the lower panel, are represented the Faithful Departed, whom we love, for whom we pray and whom we especially remember on this day.
