Lenten Observances 2013

The Most Reverend Bishops Robert Shaheen and Gregory Mansour have issued the following Lenten guidelines for the Maronites of the United States:

- All Maronites who are physically capable are to abstain from meat on Ash Monday (February 11) and all Fridays of Lent.
- ❖ Ash Monday and the Great Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.

Distribution of Ashes

All parish priests are to bless and distribute ashes on Ash Monday during the celebration of the Divine Liturgy as indicated in our liturgical books. This ceremony may not be celebrated on the vigil of Ash Monday (Cana Sunday). For the convenience of some faithful of the Latin Church who may come to Mass at a Maronite Church on their Ash Wednesday, ashes that were blessed on Monday may be given to them after the Mass. However, ashes are not to be blessed again on this day.

Season of Great Lent – Miracle at Cana in Galilee

Great Lent is a time for change, for transformation. The Maronite Church begins Lent with Cana Sunday, a commemoration of the transformation of water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana at Galilee. Cana, situated 750 feet above sea level, was the town of Nathaniel.

According to Jewish law, the wedding of a virgin was to take place on a Wednesday. The wedding was to be followed by 8 days of celebration and an abundance of food and drink was essential. At this wedding, wine began to diminish. Fortunately for the groom and his guests, Jesus and his Mother were there.

Mary mentions to Jesus that something has gone wrong: "They have no wine." Jesus understood that his mother was not simply making an observation but was seeking his powerful intervention. She was confident that he would listen to her. At first, Jesus responded with an apparent refusal: "Woman (a term of respect which he would also use on the cross) how does this concern of yours involve me?" He responded that his hour had not yet come, namely the hour of his death and resurrection, after which he would answer all the prayers of his Mother.

Mary knew her prayer would not be refused and told them to do whatever he told them. She tells the servants, as she tells all of us, to do whatever her Son tells you.

Jesus instructed the servants to fill 6 waterpots. The number six might be significant because in at that time, six was an imperfect number (7 was considered perfection). The 6 waterpots can represent the imperfection of the old law which Jeus is to fill with the wine of the Gospel and of his grace. These jars held 180 gallons of water which was transformed into excellent wine. What was originally lacking is now to be found in superabundance.

Aside from the rich theological significance of this transformation, consider the simplicity of the act. Jesus recognized the lack of wine would be an embarrassment to the groom and misfortune for the guests. He used his great power to save a simple man of Cana from humiliation. Let us imitate his example by by concern for and assistance with the simple needs of those around us.



This first miracle of Our Lord, changing water into wine at the marriage feast in Cana, is the theme of the Entrance Sunday into Lent. The event is depicted in this icon on two levels, with a symbolic decorative panel dividing them. The higher level represents the marriage feast, with Our Lord seated in honor on the left and his Mother positioned between Him and the

Bridegroom and Bride. She is the Mediator and Intercessor on behalf of humanity and it is she who brings to the attention of Her Son the fact that the wine has run out. In the lower level, Christ is standing to the left of His Mother, who tells the servants to do whatever He commands them. They pour water into the water jugs which symbolize the vessels of human lives, filled with the new wine of Spirit. In the background, the wedding guests stand, observing and participating; they represent the senses.

The central decorative panel depicts the Body and Blood of Christ, as the wedding feast is symbolic of the Holy Eucharist

and a foretaste of the eternal Marriage Feast of the Lamb with His Holy Bride, the Church (Rv 19:7; 21:1).

Kids Korner Wedding Feast at Cana



In today's gospel, we learn that Jesus went to a wedding. There was no more wine. Jesus told the servants to fill 6 pots with water. These pots were very large. In those days, all homes had pots that held water for cooking and cleaning. The pots in this picture were made from stone. They are similar to the ones Jesus blessed in Cana. How do we store water today?

Year of Faith - Mary as model for prayer

At the Wedding Feast in Cana, one of Mary's central roles is that of intercessor; she is praying for others to her Son. Notice three qualities to her prayer:

Her discernment - She notices the problem, probably even before the Groom and Bride. Indeed Mothers often notice the needs of their children before they do. But why didn't Jesus notice? Perhaps he did, and surely as God he knew. But he waits for us to ask. Yes, God waits and expects us to ask. In part this respect, for not all of us are ready to receive all his gifts. In part also, this expectation that we ask is also rooted in



God's teaching us that we must learn to depend on him and learn habitually to bring him our many needs. The Book of James says, You have not because You ask not (James 4:2).

Her diligence - Simply put, she actually prays. Rather than fret and be anxious she goes straightway to her Son

out of love for the couple (us) and trust in her Son. She sees the need and gets right to the work of praying, of beseeching her Son.

Her deference - Note that she does not tell Jesus what to do, she simply notes the need: "They have no wine." This is not directive, as if to say, "Here is my agenda and solution for this problem, follow my plans exactly, just sing here at the bottom of my plan for action." Rather she simply observes the problem and places it before her Son in confidence. He knows what to do and will decide the best way to handle things.

Thus Mary models prayer for us. Do you notice your needs and the needs of others and consistently pray? Or does it take things getting critical for you to notice or pray? And when you pray do you go to the Lord with trust or an agenda?

So the Scriptures teach that Mary is the quintessential woman of prayer, a model of prayer. She not only intercedes for us, she teaches us how to pray.
