Lenten Observances 2013

The Most Reverend Bishops Robert Shaheen and Gregory Mansour have issued the following Lenten guidelines for the Maronites of the United States:

- All Maronites who are physically capable are to abstain from meat on Ash Monday (February 11) and all Fridays of Lent.
- ❖ Ash Monday and the Great Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and



medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.

PS: Women who are pregnant and persons who are sick are not required to fast.



Season of Great Lent – Healing of the Leper

The miracle of Jesus curing the leper took place when Jesus was visiting the cities of Galilee. The man was suffering with a skin disease known as leprosy. It tortures a person for many years, destroys any human appearance and ultimately kills the individual. In the time of Jesus, the leper was declared to be "unclean" and was separated from the rest of the community.

The physical disease of leprosy can be compared to the spiritual diseases of sin. A person who sins eventually loses the image of the divine imprinted upon his soul. He becomes hateful to others and even to himself. He

becomes separated from the rest of the community, the Body of Christ, and forced to dwell alone.

In the Old Testament, a leper who was cured was treated in a manner similar to a repentant and required to offer 2 birds at the Temple. One bird was killed and the second live bird was dipped in the blood of the sacrificed bird then allowed to go free. We are also cleansed by the blood of Christ.

Consider the courage of the leper who approached Jesus for healing. According to the law, the leper was forbidden to go near people. The leper ignored the law because he wanted to be healed. Jesus did not reproach the man for breaking the law; instead, he showed him mercy. Jesus stretched out his hand and touched the leper, an act forbidden by the law. His concern was for the

desperate need of this suffering man. After curing the man, he instructed him to perform the retual imposed by the law.

The healing of the leper is seen to be not only a physical healing of the body, but also a spiritual cleansing of the soul from the terrible disease of sin. This icon is symbolic of the Sacrament of Baptism, which cleanses us from our sins and gives rebirth by the Spirit and water. As Jesus sees the leper, who is a social outcast, kneeling before Him, Our Lord comes up to him with compassion and heals him; and so Christ restores him to his place in society once more, even as He accepts us back into the fellowship of the Church, cleansed and forgiven. At the bottom of the icon are depicted the symbols of the ritual cleansing of a leper, according to the Old Testament Law- most important the offering of the two birds, one of which to be dipped in the blood of the other and set free, even as we are cleansed and set free from our sins through the sacrificial Blood of Christ.

Kids Korner

In today's gospel, Jesus heals a man with leprosy. The man showed courage and faith. He trusted that Jesus would heal him. Jesus understands our pain and suffering. He loves us. Jesus is with you always to meet your needs! Whenever you are in trouble, simply say: "Jesus, please help me!" and he's right there. His eyes are never off us!

Patriarch RAI travels to Syria, prays for peace

For the first time since 1943, a patriarch of the Maronite Catholic Church has traveled from Lebanon to Syria. Cardinal Béchara Boutros Raï visited a church in Damascus on February 9 and prayed for peace.

The prelate, who said he was moved by the sight of people fleeing Damascus, prayed "that the consciences of local, regional and international leaders are inspired to put an immediate end to the war in dear Syria ... and bring peace through dialogue."

Bishops of three Eastern Catholic churches— Maronite, Melkite, and Syrian—as well as the Latin rite, minister to Catholics in the war-torn nation.

Pope Benedict XVI Announces Resignation – DECLARATIO

Dear Brothers,
I have convoked you to this Consistory, not only for the three canonizations, but also to



communicate to you a decision of great importance for the life of the Church. After having repeatedly examined my conscience before God, I have come to the certainty that my strengths, due to an advanced age, are no longer suited to an adequate exercise of the Petrine ministry. I am well aware that this ministry, due to its essential spiritual nature, must be carried out not only with words and deeds, but no less with prayer and suffering. However, in today's world, subject to so many rapid changes and shaken by questions of deep relevance for the life of faith, in order to govern the barque of Saint Peter and proclaim the Gospel, both strength of mind and body are necessary, strength which in the last few months, has deteriorated in me to the extent that I have had to recognize my incapacity to adequately fulfill the ministry entrusted to me. For this reason, and well aware of the seriousness of this act, with full freedom I declare that I renounce the ministry of Bishop of Rome, Successor of Saint Peter, entrusted to me by the Cardinals on 19 April 2005, in such a way, that as from 28 February 2013, at 20:00 hours, the See of Rome, the See of Saint Peter, will be vacant and a Conclave to elect the new Supreme Pontiff will have to be convoked by those whose competence it is.

Dear Brothers, I thank you most sincerely for all the love and work with which you have supported me in my ministry and I ask pardon for all my defects. And now, let us entrust the Holy Church to the care of Our Supreme Pastor, Our Lord Jesus Christ, and implore his holy Mother Mary, so that she may assist the Cardinal Fathers with her maternal solicitude, in electing a new Supreme Pontiff. With regard to myself, I wish to also devotedly serve the Holy Church of God in the future through a life dedicated to prayer.

Pope Benedict thanks faithful, asks them to pray for next pope

On Wednesday, Feb. 13, 2013, Pope Benedict began his weekly general audience in Paul VI hall at the Vatican with a few remarks about his impending resignation.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As you know, I have decided [interrupted with prolonged applause] – thank you for your kindness – to renounce the ministry which the Lord entrusted to me on 19 April 2005. I have done this in full freedom for the good of the Church, after much prayer and having examined my conscience before God, knowing full well the seriousness of this act, but also realizing that I am no longer able to carry out the Petrine ministry with the strength which it demands. I am strengthened and reassured by the certainty that the Church is Christ's, who will never leave her without his guidance and care. I thank all of you for the love and for the prayers with which you have accompanied me. Thank you; in these days which have not been easy for me, I have felt almost physically the power of prayer – your prayers – which the love of the Church has given me. Continue to pray for me, for the Church and for the future Pope. The Lord will guide us.

Message from Bishop Gregory Mansour about the Pope's Abdication

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I awoke this morning, as all of you did, to the surprise news of the Holy Father's renunciation of the Petrine Ministry in the Church, to which he was elected by the College of Cardinals eight years ago. I cannot think of the Church without him at the helm. Nor could I have thought eight years ago of the Church without Blessed John Paul II. We live in Christian hope.

Pope Benedict spoke of the Church as a ship, and the one who serves at the helm, the Pope, serves in Peter, the fisherman's, place. He needs strength of soul and body to do so. Moreover, the Pope said, even though there is suffering and prayer associated with the Petrine ministry, in the modern day a Pope needs much strength to carry the Church's mission well. Pope Benedict examined his conscience many times, and he said he came to a certainty that this is his time to "let go". This is bold, loving and wise.

Notice that the Pope does not "resign". Patriarchs and Bishops resign, because they send in their resignation to the Pope. But the Pope "lets go", he used the word "renounce", which is the word we also embrace during Lent, to renounce whatever does not lead us or those we serve to be closer to God. What an act of humility and love for the Church!

The Holy Father asked all of us once again to entrust the Church to the True Shepherd, Jesus Christ, and he asked the Blessed Mother to intercede for the Church's Cardinal electors, so that by the Holy Spirit they may elect a worthy successor. The Holy Father asked God and us to forgive his shortcomings, and pledged to live the rest of his life in devoted service to the church through prayer.

Wow, what a witness to faith in God, and in his Church! The Holy Father's talk to the Cardinals, a beautiful talk given in Latin, so we know that this was quite freely and soberly thought and prayed out, can be read here:
