Lenten Observances 2013

The Most Reverend Bishops Robert Shaheen and Gregory Mansour have issued the following Lenten guidelines for the Maronites of the United States:

- ❖ All Maronites who are physically capable [...] all Fridays of Lent.
- ❖ Ash Monday and the Great Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.

PS: Women who are pregnant and persons who are sick are not required to fast.

Season of Great Lent – PARABLE OF THE PRODIGAL SON

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us of a how a son boldly goes to his father and asks for "his portion" (of his inheritance). Actually, all of the property belongs to the father and the son has no rights to any of it. How often do we treat all of the gifts of God as if they were our rightful portion rather than gifts of God. freedom and pleasure, with money in hand, the son does not concern himself about anybody or anything; he goes far from home so that no one knows what he is doing. He ran off to live among non-believers where more pleasures could be offered to him, but he soon went through all of his money. Then, a famine struck the land and he was forced to seek work in tending for pigs. The Jews considered pigs as unclean and the one who cared for pigs, as cursed. In the face of physical and moral degradation, he was forced to come to his senses. "How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough to spare, but I perish with hunger. I will arise and go to my father ...".

The father must have been waiting for his son each day because he saw him at a distance and ran out to meet him. He embraced and kissed him. He gave him a robe (a sign of honor), a ring (a sign of authority) and shoes (unlike slaves who did not have shoes). The son was treated as if he had never been away. He showed courage and humility in his return. It took courage to examine his life and ascertain his pitiful condition. It took humility to admit his mistakes to his father.

The older son represent those who prefer to see a sinner destroyed rather than saved. He is jealous and self-righteous, considering only the sins of his brother and not of his repentance. He even tries to incite the father against his brother. However, the father encouraged him to be happy because his brother, who had been lost, has been found. How joyful is heaven on the occasion of the return of a sinner to the Father.

On some occasions, we are able to identify with the prodigal son who has gone astray. Let us imitate his courage and humility and seek the forgiveness of the Father. At other times, we are able to see ourselves as the older son, righteous and unwilling to forgive the mistakes of another. At times like this, let us listen to the wisdom of the Father and be joyful at the conversion of the sinner. This icon depicts the miracle of the healing of a woman suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years. She was healed by reaching out in faith and touching the hem of Our Lord's robe. The necessity of faith in the healing, given by Christ, is further shown in the other incidents of faith and is illustrated in the lower level of the icon. These healing miracles of faith illustrate well the verse written in Syriac on each of the Lenten icons: "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God,..." (Jn 20:31)

Icon Description: This icon personifies the true meaning of Lent- the return of the wayward son, the penitent sinner, to his loving and ever compassionate Father and to his Father's house, the Church. In the center of the icon is shown the repentant son, clothed in rags and footsore, clasped in the embrace of his loving father. In the

lower panel we see three pictures depicting past events happened to the wayward son. The servant holding the new robe, the sandals and the ring, symbolizes the assured future, where the son receives once again the honored place in the family. The displeasure and jealousy of the elder son is shown here, warning us that we must be welcoming and rejoice at the return of sinners to the church.

Kids Korner

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear of a son



who asks his father for money, then leaves home and goes far away. He spends all of the money. The weather changes

and rain stops falling. Without rain, plants do not grow. The son finds work caring for pigs. He is hungry and remembers how his father's farmers ate well. Now, he is sorry for taking the money, goes home and apologizes to his father. The dad is very happy to have his son home! He gives him gifts and holds a party to celebrate. The father in the story is just like God. This is how God would feel if we ran away from him and we started doing things we shouldn't do.

He doesn't give up on us when we do things that are wrong, and he will always forgive us if we've truly changed and are sorry for what we've done. Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Confession where we can go to apologize to God and be forgiven.
