Lenten Observances 2013

The Most Reverend Bishops Robert Shaheen and Gregory Mansour have issued the following Lenten guidelines for the Maronites of the United States:

Mar. 10, 2013

- All Maronites who are physically capable [...] all Fridays of Lent.
- ❖ Great Friday of the Crucifixion is also day of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon. The rest of the day normal meals can be taken but without meat. All Maronites who are physically capable are to fast on these two days.

PS: Women who are pregnant and persons who are sick are not required to fast.

HEALING OF THE PARALYTIC

Icon Description: This icon symbolizes the healing of the paralytic in body and soul. The disciples are shown to be with Jesus, to counterbalance the members of the Sanhedrin who mingled with the crowd and who sought a way to entrap Jesus. The crowded presence of the people shows that the miracle took place when Jesus was in the house and when He came to the city. The



important role of the four friends, who brought their sick and helpless friend to Jesus, is emphasized by their position high up on the roof. In the same way, we should not, when paralyzed and helpless without Him, come to Jesus alone to receive healing; but we must bring our loved ones to Him also, through prayer and through the caring, healing ministry of the Church.

Kids Korner



Today's story is about a man who was paralyzed. Being paralyzed means he could not walk. Try to imagine how hard it would be to do things if you couldn't walk around. Jesus came to the town of

Capernaum. So many people came to see him that it was impossible to enter through the door of the house. The man's friends lowered him down through the house roof. Jesus was moved by this. He saw their faith. Jesus said "Son, your sins are forgiven." He wanted to show the Rulers that He had been given authority and power by God the Father. "Get up. Take your bed and go home." And it happened! The man got up

and walked! Like the paralytic, we must have faith in God. Not only can Jesus heal us but He can take away our sins.

Interregnum – Electing the next pope

The period of transition between the end of one papacy and the beginning of another is referred to by two names. "Sede vacante" in the Church's official Latin, is translated "vacant see," meaning that the see (or diocese) of Rome is without a bishop. In the 20th century this transition averaged just 17 days. It is also referred to as the Interregnum, a reference to the days when popes were also temporal monarchs who reigned over vast territories. The coat of arms of the Holy See also changes during this period. Instead of the papal tiara the keys, the tiara is replaced with the umbraculum or ombrellino in Italian. This symbolizes both the lack of a Pope and also the governance of the Camerlengo over the temporalities of the Holy See.

INTERREGNUM TERMS

What is a Cardinal?

The ecclesiastical rank of Cardinal dates from the time of Pope Sylvester I, around 315 AD. It was given to the closest advisors of the Pope. The actual offices held by Cardinals today are within the Roman Curia or as archbishop of an important diocese. Cardinals, therefore, are generally bishops, though the Popes may grant exceptions. In recent decades this exception has been granted for theologians the Popes have wished to honor. Under current law, a Cardinal must at least be a priest.

What is the College of Cardinals?

The College of Cardinals is composed of the men whom the Pope has elevated to the dignity of Cardinal, entrusting them with the duty to be his close advisors and collaborators, and to elect his successor. The decisions of the College are made collectively, and ratified by the Pope, unless of course there is no Pope. During such a Papal Interregnum the Cardinals gather in General Congregation to decide by majority vote on the funeral of the Pope, the beginning of the Conclave to elect a new Pope, as well as any ordinary business of the Holy See which cannot wait, in keeping with papal law, currently the Apostolic Constitution Universi Dominici Gregis.

What is a Cardinal Bishop?

Cardinals who hold the more important offices in the Roman Curia or who, being Patriarchs of Eastern Catholic Churches, have been granted equivalent dignity in law since Pope Paul VI, are called Cardinal Bishops.

What is a Cardinal Priest?

Cardinals Priests are those Cardinals who hold the middle, and by far the most numerous, rank of the College of Cardinals. They include officials of the Roman Curia, as well as Archbishops of major dioceses from around the world.

What is a Cardinal Deacon?

Cardinals Deacons hold the lowest of the ranks of Cardinals. There ranks include officials of the Roman Curia, and theologians honored by the Pope for their contribution to the Church.

Under current ecclesiastical law all cardinals under the age of 80 are eligible to vote. With 115 eligible electors, 77 votes are needed to reach the two-thirds majority to be elected pope.

I. PARISH COUNCIL, LAY ORGANIZATIONS AND COMMITTEES

- 1. **Daughters of St. Ann** E-mail from Eva regarding Bake Sale. Unable to attend because her father is still in the hospital.
- 2. **St. Maron Men's Society** Need more people. Only about 5 men showed up. Should consider an Open House on a Sat. with officers and members present to encourage others to get involved. Other suggestions: Church Day in the hall. Show movies, play cards etc... Also considering changing the meeting from Tuesday to Wednesday. Money should be deposited the same or next day for any fundraiser or event. For safety and to be considerate of those who count the money each week. Proceeds from the Cigar Night are still being calculated. Estimates are between \$375.00 \$400.00. Members will be informed of the Church Policy for the deposit of monies. Men's Club is also in need of tax exempt forms.
- 3. **Faith Formation Committee** Sr. Florence was not present. Father mentioned that a Bible study based on the Year of Faith will start during lent.
- 4. **Building & Maintenance Committee** New door installed on the back stairs to separate the hall from the Church. Need locks on both sides of the door. Attempting to finish up all the "loose ends" before the dedication. Consider having a brief meeting after Mass on Sunday to discuss progress and needs. Attempting to hook up the organ before Easter. Also will have landscaping done to give the outside a facelift. Some of the work will be weather dependant, like fences, planting etc...
- 5. **Watervliet Church Dedication Committee** Need to start working on the Commemorative Book. Nancy Nicholas, Michael Ryan and Yola Nicholas will head this project. Profits from the Commemorative Book could be around \$30.000.

II. PASTORAL PROJECTS

6. **Pastoral Visit of Bishop Gregory Mansour on December 19 & 20, 2012- Trustees Report.** Bishop Gregory was pleased with the progress of the Church. Talked about the Grant and the ongoing need for money. Discussed the number of "active" parishioners. As Trustees, the Bishop stated to Henry and Georgette if there are any problems, to discuss them with him.

It was suggested to install three flags, American, Lebanese and Papal. . So that new people will know that we are Catholic. Also suggested was a sign for the side of the building as well as the front.

- 7. Feast of Saint Maron Celebration: Mass & Luncheon-February 3, 2013. Very successful lunch. Although small in numbers, all those in attendance had a good time. Some complaints about the price were received. Profit appears to be around \$750.00. We continue to try and make our new parishioners welcome.
- 8. Lent & Holy Week Activities- Update on Saturday Mass and Parish Schedules- Joe Jabour is attempting to advertise our Mass schedule. Discussed Mass hours for Sat and Sun. Some people have requested a time change for the Masses. Discussions will continue.

III. FUNDRAISER PROJECTS

- 9. **Bulletin Ads-** Joe Jabour and Mike Rezey are working on the ads with the help of Jeanette Karam August. Father is looking for someone to be in charge of this project. Suggestion has been made to decrease the cost of the ads for parishioners. Discussion will continue in this area.
- 10. It was discussed that Henry will make an announcement at Mass regarding the cleaning of the hall after Coffee Hour.
- ✓ Meeting ended at 8:30 p.m. with a Concluding prayer.

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

In a letter sent to Bishops around the world, Cardinal Leonardo Sandri, Prefect of the Congregation for Eastern Churches, made an appeal for the Good Friday Collection in support of the Holy Land. The people of the Holy Land, along with their pastors he said, "live the mystery of Christ, Crucified and Risen for the salvation of mankind."

The Holy Land, he said, "is the silent witness and living custodian, thanks to the Latin communities of the Patriarchal Diocese of Jerusalem and the Franciscan Custody, as also to the Melkite, Maronite, Syrian, Armenian, Copt and Chaldean faithful active there".

Cardinal Sandri went on to say that the assistance that comes from the annual Good Friday collection maintains not only the Holy Sites but also the communities that dwell around them.

"Together with institutes of men and women religious, the funds collected provide immediate relief to the catastrophic consequences of war and other emergencies," he said. "Through a qualified network of pastoral, educational and health care specialists, these resources come to the aid of families, often saving lives that have been rejected: the old, the sick, and the disabled. In addition, aid is provided to those without work and to youth in search of a brighter future. In every case, the collection seeks to build up human rights, especially the right to religious liberty."




