This is the secret of Pope Francis

One of the central claims of the Catholic faith is not only that God exists, that He is real, but also that He can communicate with human beings, that human beings can be "pierced" by the actual sense of the divine presence, can experience and be aware of this real presence, can - as the very first verse of the old Baltimore Catechism taught --"know" God, then "love and serve Him."

Pope Francis, at the age of 17, while deep in prayer, was touched by God, was filled with the Spirit of God, in a very special way, and given the grace to begin a life of total commitment to God, which has ended up bringing his to the throne of St. Peter, which he will receive in tomorrow morning's Mass of installation.

We know that many young people pass through a period of time when they seek with great intensity to know their place in this world — to hear their calling, to find their true vocation. And now we know that Pope Francis passed through this process of discernment, too.

The homily of the Venerable Bede on the calling of St. Matthew "is a tribute to the divine mercy and is reproduced in the Liturgy of the Hours for the Feast of St. Matthew," the Vatican told us today in a press release.

This homily "has a particular meaning in life and the spiritual journey of the Pope," the Vatican said. "In fact," the Vatican continued, "on the Feast of St. Matthew [September 21] in the year 1953, the young Jorge Mario Bergoglio experienced at the age of 17 years, in a very special way, the loving presence of God in his life. "Following a confession, he felt his heart touched and sensed the descent of the mercy of God, who with a look of tender love, called him to the religious life, following the example of St. Ignatius of Loyola."

In these few, spare words, we are told of an experience which transformed the life of young Jorge. He felt his heart "touched" and he "sensed" the "descent of the mercy of God." He felt, "in a very special way," the "loving presence of God in his life." He felt, we are told, as if God were gazing upon him, "with a look of tender love."


These are all the elements of a personal experience of Christ (for Christ is God, and Christ is God's mercy). These are the elements of a mystical, life-transforming experience of God's actual presence, of an experience of meeting God, face to face. This is the secret of Pope Francis: that he experienced personally, in a powerful way, the goodness and mercy of God, and found the experience so powerful, that it changed his entire life, led him to become a priest, a Jesuit, and now the Bishop of Rome and head of the Church.

Prayer for Pope Francis

O God, who in your providential design willed that your Church be built upon blessed Peter, whom you set over the other Apostles, look with favor, we pray, on Francis our Pope and grant that he, whom you have made Peter's successor, may be for your people a visible source and foundation of unity in faith and of communion.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Pope Francis changes Holy Thursday plans to celebrate Mass in prison

On Holy Thursday, 28 March, the Holy Father Francis will celebrate the Chrism Mass in St. Peter's Basilica in the morning and then, in the afternoon, will go to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper at the Casal del Marmo youth detention centre and wash the feet of some of the young detainees; instead of the Basilica of St. John Lateran, where it had been traditionally held in past years.

Holy Saturday broadcast of Shroud

The Shroud, venerated as the burial cloth of Christ, bears a mysterious image of a man who suffered in a manner consistent with crucifixion. It is kept in the Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist in Turin, Italy, and is rarely available for viewing.

The extremely limited access to seeing the shroud gives the TV broadcast particular significance. It will be shown internationally by the Italian public service broadcaster Rai 1. The Holy Saturday broadcast of the Shroud images is only the second-ever, with the other occurrence taking place in 1973. The TV exhibition will last about an hour, and will be part of a celebration led by Archbishop Nosiglia.

Holy Saturday, the archbishop observed, is "a day of silence, prayer, contemplation of the mystery of the passion and death of the Lord, but also a day of expectation and openness of heart and life in the light of the resurrection."


Archbishop Nosiglia voiced his hope "that this worldwide event will leave, in the hearts of many people who will see it, a little light and peace in these complex times and give strength and hope to many sick and poor, but also families and people in need."

Hosanna Sunday

Jesus was on the way to celebrate his last passover. He was This Sunday takes its name from the joyful shouts of the children of Israel as Jesus entered the city of Jerusalem in triumph, crying out "Hosanna", which means, "Save us now, we pray!" They also shouted out: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Jesus was greeted as the Savior of Israel, the Messiah and Lord.

The procession with the psalms and olive branches that takes place on this day, originated in Jerusalem as a commemoration of Christ's triumphant entrance into the Holy City. By the fourth century, the Church in Jerusalem gathered each year to recall the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. The faithful gathered on the Mount of Olives with their bishop. There they sang psalms and hymns and listened to readings from the Old Testament and to the gospel account of the Lord's entry into the city. Late in the afternoon they went in procession from the Mount of Olives to the city of Jerusalem. The parents carried their children on their shoulders and all waved branches of palm and olive trees as they cried out: "Hosanna" and "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Upon entering the city they went to the Church of the Resurrection, which was built over the tomb of the Lord, where they ultimately celebrated the Eucharist.

As we prepare for the great week of the Lord's passion and death, we begin by recalling that Jesus was first rightly greeted by the crowds as their Messiah. These same crowds that today cried "Hosanna" would later shout "Crucify him." However, the Lord's disciples, who today rejoiced over the reception that he received from the crowds, would desert him and hide in fear. And yet, Jesus remained Messiah



even on the cross for his true glory came not at the hands of the people, but from his Father. As we follow the Lord on the way to the cross, may we remain ever faithful to him who is our Savior and Lord.

Icon Description: This icon depicts Our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, riding upon a donkey. He carries a scroll to signify that He is fulfilling the prophecies of the Holy Scripture; starting with His entrance to the day

of His suffer and death. Behind Him are his disciples, representing the New Jerusalem- the New Testament, the Apostolic Church. In front of Him are the religious leaders and the people of the Old Jerusalem- the Old Testament People of God- who would welcome Him today with palms and olive branches. Only the children are pure and holy, casting their clothes before Him and cutting down branches from the trees to greet Him. Peter is shown in front of the disciples, leading the donkey bearing Our Lord, symbolizing his future role as leader and head of the church. The colorful decoration in this icon is typically Syriac and is taken from early illustrated Gospel manuscripts.



The Sunday before Easter is called Hosanna Sunday. It is the beginning of Holy Week. It celebrates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on the

back of a donkey. Great crowds of people filled the streets waving palm branches to welcome Him. The people shouted "Hosanna" and placed olive and palm branches from the nearby trees along His path. The symbolism of the donkey is

an Eastern tradition. The donkey is an animal of peace; the horse is the animal of war. In many lands in the ancient Near East, it was customary to cover in some way the path of someone thought worthy of the highest honor. The olive and palm branches are symbols of triumph and victory.


