# Divine Mercy Sunday – the Image



The earliest element of the Devotion to the Divine Mercy revealed to St. Faustina was the Image. On February 22nd, 1931 Jesus appeared to her with rays radiating from His heart and said,

Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus I trust in You. I

desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and throughout the world. (Diary47)

I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over its enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as My own glory. (Diary48)

The two rays denote Blood and Water. the pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. (Diary299)

# Governor Cuomo's Abortion Expansor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope you are all having a Blessed & Joyful Easter Season. In this joyous time of celebrating life with the resurrection of Our Lord, we, as New Yorkers, are facing a great challenge with Governor Cuomo supporting the Reproductive Health Act Bill. This abortion expansion bill does not simply "update" New York law or codify *Roe vs. Wade*. It would usher in extreme and sweeping changes to abortion policy in New York State.

- The bill would greatly expand abortion in NYS, a state that has the highest rate of abortions in the nation.
- ➤ The bill would prevent regulation of abortion practices.
- > The bill would allow non-physicians to perform abortions.
- > The bill would declare abortion a "fundamental right".
- The bill would ensure that abortion is legal through all nine months of pregnancy, for any reason.
- The bill could threaten the religious liberty of religious hospitals and healthcare workers by requiring them to cooperate in abortions.



## Miracle of the Icon of Christ in Beirut

At the fourth session of the Seventh Ecumenical Council (in 787) [commemorated on October 11<sup>th</sup>, or the Sunday following], St Peter, Bishop of Nicomedia, in defending the necessity of icon veneration, presented an account to St Athanasius about a miracle which occurred in the city of Beret [Beirut], Phoenecia (Lebanon).





Christian. When he moved to another place, he left behind an icon of the Lord Jesus Christ. A Jew, who moved into the house, paid no attention to the icon. Once, his friend noticed of the image of Jesus Christ on the wall and said to the homeowner, "Why do you, a Jew, have an icon in your house?" He then went to the synagogue and reported this transgression of Jewish law.

The Jews expelled the owner of the house from the synagogue. They took the icon from the wall and began to scoff at it, "As once our fathers mocked Him, so we also mock Him." They spit at the face of the Lord. Hurling abuses, they lashed at the icon, they placed thorns around the head, nailed it to a tree, and put a sponge with vinegar to the mouth. Finally, they took a spear, and one of the Jews thrust it into the side of the Savior. Suddenly, from the hole in the icon made by the spear, blood and water flowed. The Jewish rabbis, seeing the miracle, said, "The followers of Jesus Christ say that He could heal the sick. Let us take this blood and water into the synagogue and anoint those afflicted with infirmities. Then we shall see whether what is spoken of Him is true."

A vessel with the blood was put in the synagogue. The inhabitants of Beret, once they learned of the miracle, began to bring those suffering from various illnesses into the synagogue. They all were healed, after being anointed with the blood from the icon of the Savior. Then the Jewish people believed in Christ and exclaimed, "Glory to You, O Christ, Whom our fathers crucified, Whom we also crucified in the form of Your icon. Glory to You, O Son of God, for having worked such a miracle! We believe in You, therefore be merciful to us and receive us!"

The Jews went to the Bishop of Beret. After showing him the wonderworking icon and the blood and water that flowed from it, they told him of their misdeed. The bishop, seeing their sincere repentance, accepted them, catechized them for many days and then baptized them. Then he consecrated the synagogue into a church of our Savior Jesus Christ. At the request of the Jews, he also consecrated other synagogues into churches dedicated to the holy martyrs. There was great joy in that city, not only because many people were healed, but

because many were baptized due to the miracles worked by the icon of the Savior."

# New Sunday

"Because you have seen Me, Thomas, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."(Jn 20:29)

Our Lord appears especially to Thomas. This is the icon which symbolizes faith. Here, Thomas is shown bending over and putting his finger into the wounded side of his Master. Our Lord, Himself, is the One who-with His own nail-

imprinted hand- holds tightly Tomas's wrist, putting his disciple's hand into His side, confirming and strengthening his faith. The other disciples stand around Jesus and Thomas, on steps ascending to where Our Lord is standing in the Resurrection robe in the center. In the background is depicted the building of the Upper room and the closed door through which the Lord entered, triumphant over death. There is



a wide use of gold in the background, symbolic of resurrection glory. There are no traces of dark colors at all in this icon; only the light colors of faith and hope and the peace of the risen Lord.

# Kids Korner



Everyone had seen Jesus die on the cross. On the Sunday that Jesus rose from the grave, he appeared to a group of his disciples. One of the disciples, whose name was Thomas, was not with them. When the others told Thomas that they had seen Jesus and that he was alive, Thomas said, "I won't believe it until I see it with my own eyes." He said

he wanted to see the nail-prints in Jesus' hands -- and the place where the spear was thrust into his side.

A week later, Thomas saw Jesus. Jesus invited Thomas to touch his hands where the nails had been. He told Thomas to put his hand in the wound in his side. Then Thomas believed! Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

A lot of people today won't believe that Jesus really rose from the grave because they haven't seen him with their own two eyes. Do you know what? It is true whether they believe it or not! You and I have never seen Jesus, we have to accept him by faith. The question is, will you believe it -- or not?

Dear Jesus, help us to accept by faith that you have risen from the grave and that you are alive. Help us to believe, because it is true, whether we believe it or not. Amen.




