Governor Cuomo's Abortion Expanson Bill

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope you are all having a Blessed & Joyful Easter Season. In this joyous time of celebrating life with the resurrection of Our Lord, we, as New Yorkers, are facing a great challenge with Governor Cuomo supporting the Reproductive Health Act Bill. This abortion expansion bill does not simply "update" New York law or codify *Roe vs. Wade*. It would usher in extreme and sweeping changes to abortion policy in New York State.

- The bill would greatly expand abortion in NYS, a state that has the highest rate of abortions in the nation.
- > The bill would prevent regulation of abortion practices.
- ➤ The bill would allow non-physicians to perform abortions.
- The bill would declare abortion a "fundamental right".
- The bill would ensure that abortion is legal through all nine months of pregnancy, for any reason.
- The bill could threaten the religious liberty of religious hospitals and healthcare workers by requiring them to cooperate in abortions.

Saint Bernadette Soubirous

St. Bernadette was born at Lourdes, France. Her parents were very poor and she herself was in poor health. One Thursday, February 11, 1858, when she was sent with her younger sister and a friend to gather firewood, a very beautiful Lady appeared to her above a rose bush in a grotto called Massabielle. The lovely Lady was dressed in blue and white. She smiled at Bernadette

and then made the sign of the cross with a rosary of ivory and gold. Bernadette fell on her knees, took out her own rosary and began to pray the rosary. The beautiful Lady was God's Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

She appeared to Bernadette seventeen other times and spoke with her. She told Bernadette that she should pray for sinners, do penance and have a chapel built there in her honor. Many people did not believe Bernadette when she spoke of her vision. She had to suffer much. But one day Our Lady told Bernadette to dig in the mud. As she did, a spring of water began to flow. The next day it continued to grow larger and larger. Many miracles happened when people began to use this water.

When Bernadette was older, she became a nun. She was always very humble. More than anything else, she desired not to be praised. Once a nun asked her if she had temptations of pride because she was favored by the Blessed Mother. "How can I?" she answered quickly. "The Blessed Virgin chose me only because I was the most ignorant." What humility! On December 8, 1933, she was canonized by Pope Pius XI as a saint in the Catholic Church. She is considered a Christian mystic. The body of St. Bernadette remains incorrupt. Her feast day is April 16th.

The Road to Emmaus Icon

"He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him." (Lk 24:30-31)

The joyful, light colors of the Resurrection continue in this

icon of the two disciples' encounter with the Risen Lord at Emmaus. Our Lord, in the center, is portrayed crossing His arms in sacramental priestly blessing as he gives the bread to the disciples. The highly decorative designs are taken from Syriac Sources and enhance the simplicity of this composition. Curtains symbolize a holy place of prayer, a home sacred by the presence of Christ.

We find the chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church in the Apostles' Creed.

7. Say the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen
