- + The Sign of Peace begins at the altar and is carried to the congregants by peace bearers.
- + Communion is by intinction and on the tongue. There is no communion in the hand.

GENERAL INTRODUCTION AND EXPLANATION

The Ancient Sources

First of all, we must look back at the liturgical sources of the Antiochene Church of which the Syriac Maronite Church is a part. From the time of the apostles, Antioch was an important Christian center. There, the Christian *Good News* originated and, from there, it spread by sea and land, to the seashores and the mountaintops.

After the Byzantine rule, Antioch was connected to the city of Jerusalem and to the liturgical movement which flourished around the 2 churches of the Nativity and the Resurrection. With the erection of the Cathedral Church of the Resurrection, the rites of the Church of Jerusalem became the focus of attention for pilgrims, as well as the source of liturgical blossoming throughout the entire East. When the Maronites emerged as a Christian Syriac Antiochene community during the 5th century, the Antiochene rites were under the influence of those of Jerusalem; particularly the liturgy attributed to Saint James, the first bishop of Jerusalem. The Maronites, however, also had a tie to another important center, that is the Syriac center of Edessa. Indeed, Edessa was the first Christian state as well as the first great political and cultural Syriac center. Its rites were connected to the Semitic, Aramaic Syriac legacy. They were not influenced by the Hellenistic Greek legacy, as was the Antiochene rite of Jerusalem; rather, they preserved their own distinctive features and expressions which were closer to the Holy Scriptures and to the original Christian theology.

According to the few documents we have at hand, the Maronite rite is closer to the Semitic Syriac rite of Edessa than to the Antiochene Hellenistic rite of Jerusalem. In the 5^{th} century, however, the differences between the two rites were barely noticeable.






Pastoral Instruction
