Some differences you may notice

- + The Entrance dialog and Consecration are in Syriac Aramaic, the language of Jesus, Mary and the Apostles.
- + The Sign of Peace begins at the altar and is carried to the congregants by peace bearers.
- + Communion is by intinction and on the tongue. There is no communion in the hand.

The Internal Order The Proclamation of the Gospel in Church

The reading of the Gospel is not a simple, hasty recitation; rather, it is an eloquent proclamation made in no haste. In some churches and circumstances, the text is chanted. Formerly, the Syriac text was chanted to a simple tune followed by the recitation of the text in Arabic. Chanting the Gospel during solemn celebrations has many benefits. We ought to return to it. There is no need to repeat that the evangelical reading focuses on the theme of the feast, that is to say, the saving event. This liturgical text ought to be simple and easy to understand. Our Maronite tradition chose the Syriac version called the *Peshitta*. It is an ancient text close to Aramaic by which our Lord, and his Apostles after him, first announced the good news. ...continued
