## The Internal Order The Proclamation of the Gospel in Church

This proclamation is known as "the simple"; the first of 3 proclamations in the Service of the *Qurbono*. It is recited after the homily with the participation of the congregation. Inspired by the theme of the feast, it is considered as a poetical and theological meditation on the celebration. The compilation of these proclamations is conserved in books proper to the deacon. They are now in the process of preparation, adding to the overall list of books for the *Qurbono*. With the present proclamation, Part One of the *Qurbono* is concluded. Candidates for baptism or catechumens are dismissed. Part Two is reserved for the faithful. This is the Eucharistic part, preceded by the transfer of the offerings, and their placement on the altar.
